Dear Mr. Myer:

I am enclosing a copy of a letter just received from General Pick in reply to our letters to him recently.

Whether General Pick's statement will satisfactorily explain the situation to you, I do not know. I do know that in the land acquisition programs at Garrison, many land-owners there have expressed themselves in strong terms of disapproval, claiming to have lost, collectively, hundreds of thousands of dollars and to have been caused much un-needed hardship and anxiety.

I would appreciate further word from you as to the final settlement of your land sale and your reaction to the army's program at Baldhill.
