Yesterday, Senator Langer paid us a very pleasant visit. The Senator is very interested in the stamp plan for relief. I believe we all feel that the Stamp Relief Plan is far better than issuing surplus commodities or rations.

The Senate will soon discuss a proposed bill for continuing relief, preferably under the stamp plan. Senator Langer desires statements from local business and professional men as to their opinion on the merits of the Stamp Relief Plan. Would you therefor prepare such a statement and mail same direct to Senator Langer at Washington, D. C.? The Senator believes that an affidavit containing such statement would be more desirable.

We at the Indian Agency here are very enthusiastic over the Stamp Relief Plan. It eliminates the necessity of overland freighting of all these supplies, and also corrects the danger of spoilage of many of such relief articles. It will be appreciated if you will furnish Senator Langer the sworn statement desired.
