With Floyd on our side of the fence, he can easily contact someone on the Fort Tottern Reservation who will be in a position to get the Indians lined up on our side on that reservation. You claim, as I understood you, when I was there in Washington, that if you could get Fort Berthold at Elbowoods, and Fort Tottern, you would be able to win out in the 1947 election.

As you know, I promised to do all I possibly can in order to put you back in office in 1947. It still holds good and will remain this way until the end of time.

Whenever you get some material ready send it to me and I will be glad to make distribution of it to the proper places in your District. We are out to reelect you to the United States Senate in 1947. Send me as much material as you wish and we shall be glad to mail it out.

We believe in putting men in office who will do the just and hororable thing to the American Indians, and we have full faith and confidence in you, and our one desire is to see you go back to Washington again in 1947.
