Dear Mr. Black Dog:

Thank you very much for your recent letter and the Fort Berthold Indian Agency News Bulletin enclosed.

You will be glad to know the House has just passed S. 2151 (identical to H. R. 10221) and it has gone to the White House for the President's signature, which would make it law. This bill, S. 2151, provides immediate payment to Indians upon showing to the Secretary of the Interior that the money will be used for rehabilitative purposes.
