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ORRIN B. LOVELL
(1923-1987)

Orrin B. Lovell was born in Grand Forks, North Dakota, on June 1, 1923. He attended the University of California at Los Angeles, and in 1950 graduated from the University of North Dakota School of Law. He later returned to Beach, North Dakota, where he opened his law practice. Mr. Lovell was a member of the State Bar Association of North Dakota and was active in the Beach American Legion, the Beach Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks Lodge No. 1137, and the Masonic Lodge. Mr. Lovell died on September 18, 1987, and is survived by his wife, Keziah, four sons, one daughter, and four step-daughters.

ROBERT D. HARTL
(1937-1987)

Robert D. Hartl was born in 1937 in New Rockford, North Dakota. After receiving his J.D. from the University of North Dakota School of Law in 1962, Mr. Hartl began practicing law in Rugby, North Dakota. During his career, Mr. Hartl served as a U.S. Magistrate, Pierce County Justice, Pierce County States Attorney, as a Tribal Judge for the Bureau of Indian Affairs on the Turtle Indian Reservation and as a City of Rugby Attorney. Mr. Hartl was also an emergency medical technician for the Rugby Emergency Ambulance Association and was active in the Geographical Center Historical Society. Mr. Hartl was a Fourth Degree Knight of the Columbus Council 4136 and was a member of the State Bar Association of North Dakota, the American Trial Lawyers Association, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks in Devils Lake, the Fraternal Order of Eagles and the Little Flower Catholic Church. Mr. Hartl died on July 29, 1987, and is survived by his wife, Gladys, and four children.
