I am writing you relative to a series of three industrial development meetings near the Indian reservations in North Dakota. These meetings were held at Dunseith, North Dakota, the evening of September 14, at New Town, North Dakota, at noon Thursday, the 15th, and at Devils Lake, North Dakota, the evening of September 15th.
