MEMORIAL SERVICES

Apparently due to a number of important matters the Supreme Court was unable to give time during the month of February for the holding of the memorial services as announced in the January issue of Bar Briefs.

The date for holding such services has now been set by the Supreme Court for the 19th day of March, 1935, commencing at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

Almost without exception everyone who has been asked has expressed his willingness to do the work and this regardless of the press of other business.
