Summary (Indicate page nos.):

In these documents the activities of the GFP attached to Army Group F are reported. A summary is provided at the end of each report. This includes a number of persons investigated, executed, turned over to concentration camps, turned over to the SD, etc.

WB-1056a - August 1944

- P. 10) 3 Croatians seized for manufacturing Communist propaganda. 392 Infantry Division orders them put into a prison camp, for sending into the Reich as labor forces.
- P. 11) 1 Croatian woman arrested and shot by 392nd Infantry Division for leading bandits to ambushing and killing a German officer.
- P. 12) 1 lawyer turned over to SD for Anglophile activities.
- P. 13) Patrols succeeding in bringing a number of prisoners; several bandits were shot. 3 clerics sentenced to death for espionage.
- P. 14) 1 [EAN?] member shot while fleeing.
- P. 15) [Servash?] bands now number 20,000; divided into 4 divisions.
- P. 19) 46,869 persons checked. 48 out of 5,632 arrested were executed, 160 turned over to the SD, 213 to military courts, 565 turned over for labor employment, etc. [4?] shot in attempting to flee.

WB-1056b - September 1944

- P. 30) 9 Greeks arrested and put aside for labor service, because they wanted to smuggle people to Corfu.

Summary (cont'd)

P.32) 5,905 persons examined, 2,148 arrested, 15 executed. 39 turned over to the SD, 120 turned over to the military courts, 1,131 turned over for labor employment, etc. 3 shot in attempting to flee.

WB-1056c - October 1944

Pp. 37-38) 2 Croats arrested for espionage and shipped off to the Reich for forced labor.

P. 38) The pilot of a German medical corps plane which had made an emergency landing was attacked and murdered. 8 Croats were convicted of having knowledge of the attack and sent into the Reich for forced labor.

P. 41) 7,885 persons examined, 1,001 arrested, [7?] turned over to the SD, 83 turned over to military courts, 264 turned over for labor employment, etc.

WB-1056d - November 1944

P. 47) 7,821 persons examined, 291 arrested, 2 executed, 3 turned over to the SD, 136 turned over for labor employment, etc.

P. 52) Some Pravoslavs travelling into the Reich for labor employment have been sent to concentration camps (by the Ustasi).

WB-1056e - December 1944

P. 57) Speech of Weichs about the activity of the GFP in the Southeast area and the intelligence situation in Croatia.

P. 62) 26,481 persons examined. 597 arrested, 2 turned over to the SD, 17 turned over to military courts, 182 turned over for labor employment, etc.
